

The International Communications Association (ICA) Regional Conference will be held at the City (Gardens Point) Campus of the Queensland University of Technology, Brisbane, Australia, from 1-3 October 2014.

Conference theme: Digital Transformations, Social Media Engagement and the Asian Century

The conference theme draws together three elements. First, the rise of the digital economy has meant that "born digital" firms, industries and practices are transforming media and communications industries and professions. Second, the rise of social media is rapidly transforming a range of communications professions and practices, such as journalism, public relations, political communication and health communication, as well as the relationship of audiences to media content. Finally, there has been a shift in geo-economic power balances going on for some years from the Atlantic Corridor to the Asia-Pacific, associated with the rise of Asian nations in the global economy.

The conference is now seeking extended abstracts (1000-2000 words) and panel proposals related to the thematic areas of:

The deadline for extended abstracts & panel proposals is **Friday 22 April 2014**. Registrations open on 25 April, and all submitters will be advised of acceptance no later than early June.
